Can you research the different ways our country produces electricity?</p>	<p>In art, we are using charcoal to create cityscapes and landscapes. Can you use a pencil, chalk, charcoal or something similar to create your own?</p>
<p>Complete some research about examples of ways that people in our community are helping or damaging the planet.</p>	<p>We are looking at the journey of life in RE. Can you tell the story of the best journey you have ever been on OR write about someone else's life story?</p>	<p>In 'Tin Forest' we have looked at a man who makes something beautiful. Can you build something from recycled materials?</p>
<p>Build a board game which tests Year 4's knowledge of their learning – this could be maths, English or other subject areas</p>	<p>How can we protect our planet? Design a helpful poster to show families how small changes at home can make a big difference to the whole planet.</p>	<p>Conduct an interview with someone at home: are they worried about the planet? What can we do to help?</p>
