<p>Sketch a wonderful landscape. It could be somewhere you have been or somewhere you want to go. What detail do you need in the foreground or background?</p>	<p>With an adult, look at properties and changes. What examples can you find of different changes e.g. water to ice or items that burn? Can you see any examples of reversible or irreversible changes?</p>	<p>Build the British Isles! Can you draw or build these and add landmarks such as Big Ben, Stonehenge, Ben Nevis or even show what is well-known in different parts of the country e.g. coal mining or tourism</p>
<p>Create a timeline. It could be of your life or someone else's. Alternatively, it could be of a famous place or a period of history.</p>	<p>Design a computer game. What are the rules? How do you gain rewards or upgrades? What features will each level have to keep gamers entertained?</p>	<p>Find some leaflets in a local tourist information place or library. Then form your own tourist information leaflet about a familiar place or somewhere you have visited.</p>
<p>Go and explore the Aire valley. Why do you think the river, canal and railway are in the same place? What features does it have?</p>	<p>Form a new country. What features will it have and how will you help people move around and travel beyond the country.</p>	<p>Can you design a SAFE science experiment to test an idea? How will you present your ideas?</p>
