



# Challenge homework, Year 5, Spr 1

Happy new year! The homework below is set so it allows creativity, conversation and most of all, enjoyment for learning. Build a Greek town and a British town – either from 2018 or from over 2000 years ago. Explain the difference between the two using conjunctions as you are building.	In RE, we are looking at how God is both holy and loving. How can we show that we are loving or caring? Think of an imaginative way to show your ideas.	Britain is a democracy. Explore what this means and if you can see any news stories which show democracy in action. How does it help?
Design a feast! Perhaps you can do this with family and maybe even make it. Could you use the Fuel for School produce to help with this.	To link with our computing, write a 'blog' of what has happened to you at school or out of school over the course of a week. This can be written or typed.	Make a mosaic of something important to you or perhaps of something which is vital to making our school such a wonderful place to be.
Examine the night sky. Write some observations or make some sketches of what you can see. Research anything else you want to know.	There is so much news every day and sometimes, it can always seem like bad news. Can you write an uplifting, 'good news' newspaper report?	Can you find examples of fractions in the real world? And how about percentages? Find examples and talk about them. Bring some to school if you can.
