Below is a menu of homework which we would like the children to choose from. Within classes, key stage 2 will be celebrating the homework completed. 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| <p>Make a detailed sketch of a family pet, a minibeast found outside or an animal seen elsewhere. Label it with its key features.</p>  | <p>Design an app for a phone. Consider who it is trying to help and what it is aiming to do. Create an ideas board of how it would work so you could present it at 'dragons' den'.</p> | <p>Build or draw a desert island. Make it as detailed as possible so it is helpful to other explorers. Use maps to identify what other detail you can add e.g. contours, rivers etc.</p> |
| <p>Message in a bottle! Imagine you are lost on a desert island. Write down what has happened, what is on the island and how you can be found. Then roll your message up and bring it to school in a bottle!</p> | <p>Talk to your family and friends about where they have visited. Where have they been and how did they get there? What was special about the place they visited?</p>                  | <p>Find some leaflets in a local tourist information place or library. Then form your own tourist information leaflet about a familiar place or somewhere you have visited.</p>          |
| <p>What was the best journey you have ever been on? Create a piece of writing, artwork or even film to give a recount of what you did.</p>   | <p>Invent a new animal. Consider how an animal could still evolve and become even more suited to its environment.</p>  | <p>Build or design a new town, city or country. Show it as a map. Add the detail you would expect to see on a map.</p>   |
